Finding out if a patient has terminal heart disease can be difficult for everyone involved: the patient, the family, and even the doctor. Heart failure's final stages can progress in an unpredictable manner, with a wide range of symptoms. Since most heart disease patients don't qualify for hospice care, they are left without the emotional and physical support they need.

When a patient's life expectancy is six months or less, they are considered to be in the final stages of heart disease. In general, a patient is eligible for hospice care if one of the following applies:

 Advanced heart failure or frequent angina due to a coronary artery disease (chest pain resulting from insufficient supply of blood and oxygen to the heart).

- Patients with this condition have a compromised heart and experience symptoms such as exhaustion, shortness of breath, or functional decline.
- Doesn't need any more surgery or medical intervention because he or she has already received the best treatment available.

- When medical needs can't be met at home, patients are admitted to an inpatient facility for treatment.
- For caregivers, respite care is an opportunity to give the patient a brief break from their caregiving duties.

- Personal care and hygiene, light housekeeping, light laundry, and occasional shopping can all be handled by a hospice aide.
